

## **Impact Statement Review 2015/16**

The **Sport Funding Premium of £9005** has allowed us to give our children an enhanced experience of sports and outdoor activities alongside their continued 2 hours of school curriculum entitlement.

Following our Impact Statement Review, we can report:

- The enhancement of our OAA provision. As well as increasing our Wild Tribe provision to support our 2 form Year 3 classes, we have started Forest Crew which aims to give all of our Year 5 children experience outdoors while developing their skills in this environment. This has included training more staff so that we can provide the course without the need of outside agencies every term.
- We have entered a variety of competitions, both in our cluster and in the Salford area including: girls football tournaments, Year 5 football tournaments, Year 6 SPSSA football league, cricket tournament, hockey tournament, tri-golf tournament, rugby tournament, wrestling tournament, swimming gala, gymnastics competition, athletics competitions, lacrosse tournament as well as partaking in a sports festival for children who hadn't yet had the chance to represent school in any competitions.
- We had the following Sports companies assisting us with either PE lessons and/ or after school clubs including: Manchester United Foundation, Salford City Reds, Lancashire Cricket Club, Sharples Wrestling, Fencing, Eccles Rugby Club, Salford Leisure and Sale Sharks.
- We took part in a variety of sporting events to help raise money for charities such as a Mile run for Sport Relief, Race for Life and a dodgeball tournament for the British Heart Foundation.
- We have had more after school clubs than ever including: football team training, football club (Y4,5, and 6) football club (Y 1,2 and 3), girls football, multi-sports club (Y1,2 and 3) multi-sports club (Y4,5 and 6), dance club, gymnastics club, cricket club and rugby club.
- We purchased new kit for the sports teams when representing the school in competitions.
- We purchased a springboard to develop the gymnastics skills of our pupils in class and for the after school club.
- We have developed our playground with the addition of lines to mark out a netball/ football pitch.

All of this has enabled us to maintain our Gold Kitemark which we also received last year.

This funding has again allowed Lewis Street to enter more competitions than ever before, and have more coaches in to develop the children's skills further, this has shown in the competitions as we have won 2 cluster comps. We have also been able to run and take part in more inter-schools and class competitions than previously.

Funding has been used to provide CPD for staff at Lewis Street through programmes such as Wild Tribe and the set up of Forest Schools. This means we are able to run our own interventions to enable more children to participate in activities.

All of the above has also allowed Lewis Street to achieve Gold level Kite Mark for the first time.
